the ecumenical patriarchate In its disputed 28th Canon, the Council of Chalcedon in 451 recognized an expansion of the boundaries of the Patriarchate of Constantinople and of its authority over bishops of dioceses "among the barbarians", which has been variously interpreted as referring either to areas outside the Byzantine Empire or to non-Greeks. The council resulted in a schism with the Patriarchate of Alexandria.

Three patriarchates were established by the apostles as apostolic sees in the 1st century: Rome, Antioch, and Jerusalem. Added to these were Constantinople in the 4th century, and Jerusalem in the 5th century.
